

# Creating Reality

Recent discussions in the comments have touched on timelines and creation of reality. I asked one reader often using the compound word "timeline" to offer a definition or understanding of what it means or should, as used in the comments. That it is "non-linear" was also suggested, but again no definition of its non-linearity came back.

It's a debatable subject; we turn to the Committee for input.

*Q: Committee, please, what is a timeline?*

C: Greetings, salutations and welcome back all and one. A timeline is a calendar and a schedule which uses one.

*Q: To say different timelines exist means what?*

C: Different courses of action, different series of events occurring along a timeline are what this means.
