

Economics in Heaven

Q: *Most Esteemed Committee, anybody can study the history of money but nowhere in that exercise would a plan be found to eliminate it. The assumption is, money as a medium of exchange is a good thing, all we humans need do is distribute it better, whatever better might mean. How does Heaven function without money?*

Q: *What other ways?*

C: It is.

Q: *How do humans eliminate money?*

C: That would be interference and would not work, because humans would retain the want of money. Money must be discarded voluntarily by humans.

Q: *No, really....how would mankind switch from what we have now, to a society where no money is used?*

C: First all humans must dispose of money. This would happen if humans were convinced a system could be implemented where a medium of exchange such as money is not necessary. Few humans are willing to devise such system.

Q: *Not enough humans. If y'all would help me, we could write a book about it.*

C: The book would not be about money, it would be about human perceptions, choices and preferences. Economics is the study of human behavior, expressed through the exchange of goods and services. Such book would involve new sets of behaviors.

These would have to be adopted voluntarily, and that means gradually. It is your soul's nature never to be forced, because your mind works this way also. You know you retain complete control over your mind, unless a force acts upon the human body to temporarily disconnect the mind from the body.

Q: *Okay, let's start. What would be the first step to evolving from money to no money?*

Communism fails because it requires force to overcome impatience. Humans cannot be forced because humans' minds, the essence of a human, cannot be forced. Humans temporarily constrain other humans but confuse this with force, which is an illusion, often a delusion.

Q: *But the world is so complicated. I cannot just ask a doctor to treat me, or ask a drug company to provide medication, or request engineers to build me a device.*

C: Of course you can, but you do not.

Q: *Okay, how do we gradually go from the money based economic system humans use to something more improved?*

C: Technology now allows transactions to be instant in nearly every case. It is quite easy to make all transactions of all goods and services available to all suppliers and customers. It is also easy, with modern human technology, to make the total supply of money instantly known to all people.

Humans want secrecy, humans create governments, humans use these creations to confiscate money, so humans wish to conceal money to reduce government confiscation and the cycle repeats.

These are not required but are choices.

Humans have decided certain things should not be done, and impose penalties, fines and even prison time for violations of rules. These restrictions have one principal effect, to increase the price of the

product or service. Concealment naturally follows; the solution is to eliminate the restriction on the product or service and allow all providers and customers to see how many units anonymously but instantly, and at what prices, have been transacted.

Q: *Is this how other civilizations on other planets do it?*

C: Some yes, but not many.

Q: *I can see drug dealing and prostitution being opposed to this.*

C: This is the human choice; you wish to conceal things.

Q: *So the world would function with an international system of credits, and all national currencies would disappear.*

C: That is an option, yes.

Q: *What about monetary authorities, central banks and cash creation?*

C: These would be equally transparent. We can assure you, elected officials would not like this, but remember as we have said many a time, YOU ALL ARE your elected officials. Choose new ones who accept the transparency.
